A member of the public congratulated Ripley Town Council on the magnificent floral displays around the township.

A member of the public spoke about the climate emergency and the fact it isn't helped with the lack of public transport in Ripley. There used to be three railway lines in Ripley. The benefit to cost ratio was carried out at 1.5 to 1. Ripley's score was 0.2. In August 2019, plans were revealed for extending Nottingham's tramline to Ikea at Giltbrook, then possibly extend into Amber Valley. Has anyone seen this report?

A member of the public spoke about the climate change emergency that the UK Government declared on 1st May 2019. Every small difference we make will add up to a larger whole. Let's keep up our positive actions. Plan for paperless offices, encourage more recycling from the public and have new recycle bins installed in town. AVBC have announced plans for tree planting — could we encourage children now to find acorns, conkers and sycamore seeds and get them excited to see their own saplings grow? I will personally provide 50 litre bag of soil and some pots to help this venture if wanted. It's not only a case of 'we must do it' but we can do it and have some fun! We could maybe have a vegetarian day in the market to introduce people to foods they may not have tried before and reduce beef consumption for instance?

Cllr Freeborn reported that the Project Officer has prepared a draft action plan for the township which is currently out for consultation with local groups for their comments. When the action plan has been consolidated, we will have a report made to the Council by the Project Officer. This will be in October or November 2019.

170919/19 Planning Applications

AVA/2019/0697 Former Butterley Ironworks Coach Road Butterley Park RipleyCllr Freeborn reported that this item has been considered by the Planning Committee, however two addendums need to be made to our previously submitted objection. These are:

- 1. The only access from the surface of the site to the unique 18th Century underground wharves of the Cromford Canal the 'wide hole' (a Scheduled Ancient Monument) the only access will be lost to a residential road and should not be allowed to happen.
- 2. The site is part of a water supply chain that starts at the pond on Nottingham Road Rec, to a pond by the Sainsburys corner, to a pond in Carr Wood (at the top by the cut through, to the pond at the bottom of Carr Wood that abuts the Butterley site, goes through it and on into Butterley Res.

It currently carries pollution from Sainsburys, ie. Petrol, diesel and salts from the fillings station and supermarket car park. This is via its approved site surface water drainage system into Carr Wood where the first pond is pretty lifeless and stagnant. We are trying to tackle that pollution through The River Starts Here project.

RESOLVED the two addendums be submitted to Amber Valley Borough Council as part of the Ripley Town Council response to this planning application.
