At the meeting of Ripley Town Council in November 2020, it was reported to us from a representative of Derbyshire County Council that, as a matter of urgency, the barriers at the top and bottom of Oxford Street in Ripley were going to be replaced. Unfortunately his still has not happened. We hope to give you a more positive update in our next newsletter.

River Starts Here Project update



We hope you've been enjoying being able to wander along Ripley Greenway without the huge puddles getting in the way between Peasehill Road and Marehay!

In November 2020 we spent a week creating two small meanders in the small stream to drain the puddles. Close by, we took the water into shallow hollows called swales which lead slowly back towards the stream, and created habitat banks for butterflies and other wildlife. Sometimes these swales will be wet and other times dry. Flowers, insects and frogs like this sort of place. In spring we hope to add wild flowers - and you and your family are welcome to help (Covid permitting).

We were hoping to replace two unofficial crossings made of half bricks with bridges made from sleepers to make the stream flow better, look better and keep feet dry, but volunteers could not do this safely in 2020. We hope to do it in 2021.

We were lucky to have some additional people power from a small group (Covid safe) of young people who attend Derbyshire Adult and Community Education Service. They helped us to repair a badly eroded bank with brushwood bundles called 'faggots', backfilling with earth and gravel. These simple wooden bundles of sticks are held in with stakes and do an amazing job of preventing the banks from eroding.

Taken together, the stream, these meanders and swales will form a network which will help wildlife here and downstream. So instead of being a problem, the water will sustain wildlife.

We have worked closely with Derbyshire County Council who own the land and the Friends of Ripley Greenway, and the Town Council have supported us too.














New Year Honour for Ripley Town Councillor
