As a church we believe we need to look after the world God gave us and there is a lot we can all do to improve the way we live in a more environmentally friendly way.

We can all **Reduce, Re-use and Recycle**, even small changes can make a big difference. We have a regular newsletter available from the church which gives lots of information and ideas, so do pick one up!

Come on Ripley, together we can restore our environment for good!

There are recycling boxes in the church porch to encourage recycling of things which cannot be recycled locally as yet. We are collecting:

Crisp packets

Biscuit wrappers

Chocolate and sweet wrappers

Plastic lids of all kinds (not just milk bottle lids)

All items must be clean please!

Church is open Sunday, Mon, Wed and Fri mornings for you to deposit your items. They will then go to various different places –

Plastic lids – Stormboard, to make shelters for refugee camps

Shoes – to be recycled, with Variety children's charity

Crisp wrappers – Derby Royal Hospital

Other wrappers – Terracycle a national recycling organisation

15th - 20th June – Rubbish Art Festival

We are inviting groups in the area, including schools, to take part and produce pictures, sculptures and other art works using rubbish. These will be displayed at church and the church will be open for you to visit.

Certificate of Merit and launch of the new Youth Award



Do you know someone in the Ripley Township (Ripley, Waingroves, Marehay, Ambergate, Nether Heage, Heage, Bullbridge, Sawmills, Street Lane or Lower Hartshay) who is deserving of recognition for their voluntary work within our local community? If so, we want to hear about them! We have two categories that you can nominate them in: the **Certificate of Merit** (for people over 18 years of age) and the **Youth Award** (for people aged 11-18 years of age).

For the first time this year, we are launching a new Ripley Town Council Youth Award. This is about recognising and celebrating the outstanding achievements of the brilliant young people in our township.

We are looking for nominations from members of the public, including friends and neighbours along with schools, youth groups and voluntary organisations. We would love to hear about a young person who has:

- ◆ provided an outstanding community and voluntary service and has made a significant contribution to their community
- ◆ gone out of their way to help and improve the life of fellow residents and or neighbour(s) in their local communities
- ◆ led others to bring about positive change in their community, school or area
- ◆ a positive attitude and approach and has inspired others or who has gained vital life skills to help them overcome challenges and achieve their goals
- ◆ shown dedication in giving their free time to a project and made a difference in their community or who regularly goes out of their way to help other people or has caring responsibilities for a family member.

Youth Award nomination rules:

- The young person being nominated must live in the township.
- Nominees must be at least 11 years old and no older than 18 by the 20 July 2020.
- You cannot nominate a young person you are related to.
- You can only submit one nomination.
- Self-nominations will not be accepted.
- **The person you are nominating must agree to being nominated.**
- Parent / guardian must agree to the nomination.
- You cannot nominate if you are a serving Council member.
- You agree that by submitting a nomination you are happy for the young person's name and photograph to be included in press / media releases.
- Nominations for party political related work cannot be accepted.
- Nominations must be received at the Ripley Town Council office, either in electronic or hard copy by **23rd October 2020**.
- Ripley Town Council's decision is final.
- The winner will be announced at the Full Council Meeting Nov 17th 2020. If you have been fortunate to win, please keep the Christmas Light Switch On date **Fri 29th Nov 2020** free to receive your certificate and prize.

Something to think about...

This newsletter is sent to 14,100 households in the Ripley Township. If each household spend just £5 per week in a Ripley shop, that would be £70,500 into the local economy each week. That's £3.7 million per year.
